Dear Club Presidents and Representatives,

Subject: New ATTA Membership Fee Schedule for the 2026–2027 Membership Year

On behalf of the Alberta Table Tennis Association (ATTA), we would like to thank all of our affiliate clubs for your continued support and contribution to the development of table tennis in Alberta.

Following a review of our membership structure, the ATTA Board has approved a new membership fee schedule for the 2026–2027 membership year.

The new structure is intended to provide greater flexibility for clubs and individual players while ensuring that ATTA membership is maintained by those who wish to participate in and support the provincial association's activities and programs.

New Membership Fee Schedule

Club Membership:

Effective September 1, 2026, the annual ATTA club membership fee shall be:

- \$50 for a club with fewer than 50 verified individual members; and
- \$150 for a club with 100 or more verified individual members.

In addition to the applicable club membership fee, a club shall pay the following annual ATTA registration fee for each verified individual member included on its membership list:

- Adult: \$10 per person
- Junior: \$5 per person

Individual ATTA Membership:

Individuals who wish to become ATTA members directly, rather than through an affiliated club, shall pay:

- Adult: \$20 per year
- Junior: \$15 per year



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Direct individual members shall receive the membership privileges applicable under the ATTA bylaws, policies and regulations.

Under the new structure, club members who wish to become ATTA members will be required to register with their club and pay the applicable individual ATTA membership fee.

Individuals who choose not to become ATTA members may continue to participate in their club's activities as permitted by the club but will not receive the benefits or privileges associated with ATTA individual membership.

The new fee structure will take effect on September 1, 2026, and will apply to all new and renewing memberships for the 2026–2027 membership year.

We ask all affiliate clubs to communicate this change to their members and ensure that membership information and fees are submitted to ATTA in accordance with the new schedule.

We appreciate your cooperation and continued partnership. Together, we can maintain a strong, transparent, and sustainable provincial table tennis organization and continue to provide opportunities for players of all ages and skill levels across Alberta.
